Dear Upper Arlington,

It was an amazing year at the Upper Arlington Public Library. Due to your generous support in passing the 2022 operating levy, we were able to make some incredible improvements and planning for the future.

Our first priority was reviewing and making salary adjustments for our staff that are competitive with other local libraries and employers. We spent many months researching industry data and working with a consultant on a comprehensive salary study. These efforts resulted in an average salary increase of 16%, which included a years-of-service salary range to ensure increases for long-time staff.

Second, we worked on a Master Facilities Plan with HBM Architects and Interior Designers that included a building assessment with repairs listed by urgency and cost estimates, a library space assessment, and community engagement for ways to improve space and functions.

Despite the drop in use during the pandemic, use of the library skyrocketed in 2023 for circulation and program attendance.


Books and eBooks are More Popular than Ever

Looking at straight checkouts of items, not including renewals, we are able to see what patrons are taking out most. In 2023, patrons checked out more books than in any of the past eight years. Our adult book circulation is continuing to trend higher than our movie circulation by almost double.



Moving Our Movies and Music

With the rising popularity of streaming services, we've experienced a significant decrease in the use of our movie and music collections (see below). We moved our media collection to the Adult Department in 2023. The former media area has been repurposed for programming and study space, and soon as staff workspace during our lower level renovation. Patrons currently enjoy lounge-style seating with power nearby.



2023 Fiscal Stewardship

Last year was the Upper Arlington Public Library's first year seeing the revenue from the levy that passed in May 2022. We transferred \$1.2 million into our building improvement fund this year to prepare for large capital repairs and replacements.



HBM Architects & Interior Designers

We hired GBM in 2023 to conduct a 10-Year Master Facilities Plan. The plan includes assessments of needed repairs and use of space, as well as opportunities for community engagement around the process.

Rewarded Tenure

We included a years-of-service salary range to ensure increases for longtime staff. 2023 was the lowest year for turnover in the past 10 years, and we celebrated two major retirements of longtime staff.

Increased Paid Time Off

We added two additional paid federal holidays (Martin Luther King Jr. Day and Juneteenth). We provided more benefits for part-time staff, including more vacation and sick leave, and paid holidays.

Open Communication

Staff participated in focus groups and surveys to gather employees' thoughts and questions about culture, communication and facility needs. We started a Staff Internal Communications Committee with staff from many levels and departments.



In recognition of our incredible staff, Library leadership has dedicated significant time and resources in recent years to meet continued needs expressed by staff to make UAPL a better place to work and grow.

Biggest Year Ever for Programs

There is always something going at the Library to serve our community: farm and zoo animal visits, kitten and goat yoga, author events, storytimes, live music, a mystery dinner, lectures, summer and winter reading, and an explosion of holiday and summer fun.
