Picture Books (P)

Becker, Bonnie. A Library Book for Bear.

Durrand, Hallie. Catch That Cookie!

Lin, Grace. Ling & Ting: Twice as Silly.

Hayes, Geoffrey. Benny and Penny in Lost and Found.

Green, Poppy. A New Friend (The Adventures of Sophie Mouse).

Excitedly resuming school after a long winter break, Sophie Mouse must convince her forest friends that Owen, a snake newcomer to the class, is not as scary as he seems.

Hiranandani, Vera. Lunch Will Never Be the Same!

When Camille, a tall French girl, arrives at school with unusual lunches, third-grader Phoebe neglects her best friend Sage to get invited to Camille's house for dinner to see what other mysterious food Camille eats.

Roland, Timothy. Monkey & Me and the Golden Monkey.

Clyde is a hyperactive kid, and his twin sister, Claudia, does her best to keep him out of trouble--but after a class field trip to the science museum, and a zapped banana, he suddenly finds that excitement transforms him into a real monkey, which may help him catch the thief who took the golden monkey.

Non-Fiction

Jackson, Ellen. Tooling Around: Crafty Creatures and the Tools They Use.
