## Ambrose, Sophie. The Lonely Giant.

After a full day of evil schemes, fairy tale baddies return home to spend time with their friends and get ready for bed in this cozy bedtime book.

#### Verde, Susan. The Water Princess.

Follows the experiences of a young girl who dreams of bringing clean drinking water to her African village as she rises early every morning and makes long journeys to the well with a heavy pot that she carries on her head.

# Early Graphic Novels (Graphic Novel E)

## Yoon, Salina. Duck, Duck, Porcupine!

Big Duck likes to boss around her brother, Little Duck, and she fancies herself the leader of their trio when joined by their friend Porcupine. Little Duck does not speak yet, but through his expressions and his actions, he shows that he has a better grasp on any situation than his older sister.

#### Yoon, Salina. My Kite Is Stuck and Other Stories.

A trio of stories follows Big Duck, whose adventures include getting his kite out of a tree when it becomes stuck; navigating the shoals of jealousy when Porcupine and Little Duck find a new friend; and forgetting something very important while building a lemonade stand with Porcupine.
