Library Hours Expanding Sept. 7

You'll soon be able to visit us a little longer in the afternoon and evening.

Beginning Tuesday, September 7, our Main and Lane Road Libraries will be open an hour later from Monday through Saturday. New operating hours at these locations are 10 a.m.-8 p.m. on Monday-Thursday, 10 a.m.-6 p.m. on Friday, and 10 a.m.-5 p.m. on Saturday.

Our Miller Park Library will be open later on Tuesday, Thursday and Saturday only. Miller Park's new operating hours are 10 a.m.-5 p.m. on Monday, Wednesday, Friday and Saturday; 10 a.m.-8 p.m. on Tuesday and Thursday.

Another change coming on September 7 is the reopening of the Main Library's Meeting Room B and the Lane Road Meeting Room for public reservations. Upper Arlington Author Series Welcomes Madeline Miller

After a hiatus last year due to the pandemic, the Upper Arlington Author Series is scheduled to return this fall with a presentation by Madeline Miller, author of bestsellers *The Song of Achilles* and *Circe*.

Miller will speak on Sunday, October 24 at 2 p.m. in the UA Main Library's atrium. General admission tickets for the talk are \$20 and will go on sale October 1 at www.ualibrary.org. Seating is limited.

A post-talk reception with the author is being planned by our co-sponsor, the Upper Arlington Community Foundation. Details will be available soon.

Please note that this event is subject to change based on health authority guidelines that might affect gathering size or the author's ability to travel.

Madeline Miller grew up in New York City and Philadelphia. She attended Brown University, where she earned her BA and MA in Classics.

Her first novel, *The Song of Achilles*, was awarded the 2012 Orange Prize for Fiction and was a New York Times Bestseller. Her second novel, *Circe*, was an instant #1 New York Times bestseller, and won the Indies Choice Best Adult Fiction of the Year Award and the Indies Choice Best Audiobook of the Year Award, as well as being shortlisted for the 2019 Women's Prize for Fiction. *Circe* also won The Red Tentacle Award, an American Library Association Alex Award, and the 2018 Elle Big Book Award. It is being adapted for a series with HBO Max.

Her novels have been translated into more than 25 languages.

She has also studied at the University of Chicago's Committee on Social Thought, and in the Dramaturgy department at Yale School of Drama, where she focused on the adaptation of classical texts to modern forms.

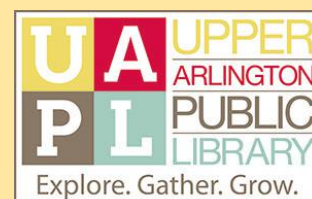

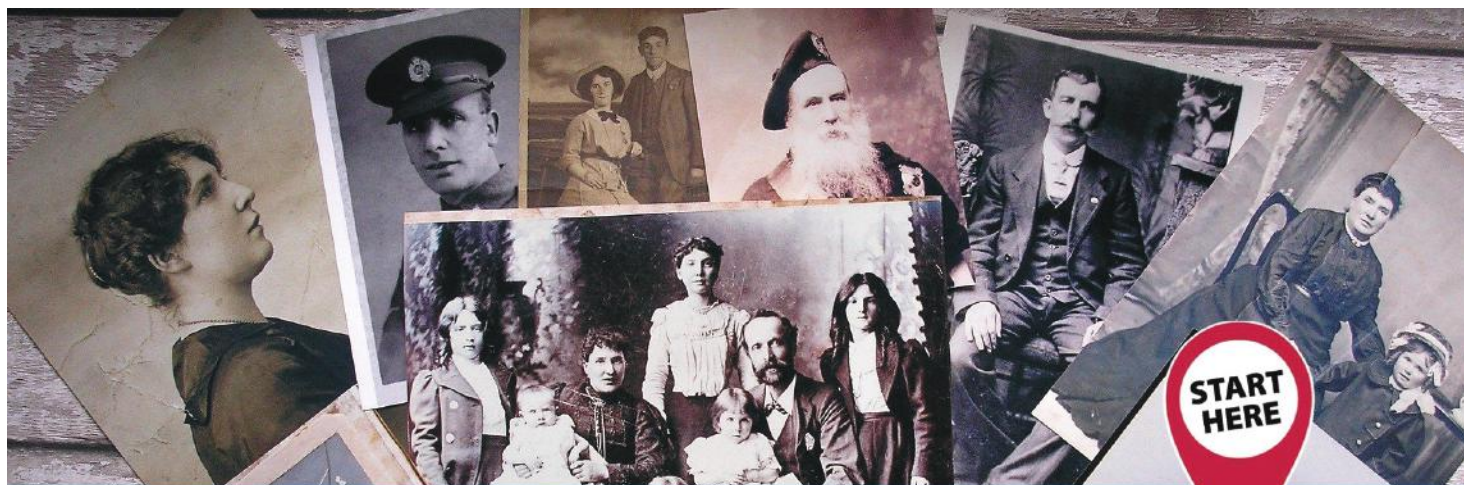
