Library Offers Light Therapy Lamps

We're excited to announce that we've added six light therapy lamps to our collection for patrons to take home and use.

According to the Mayo Clinic, a light therapy lamp mimics outdoor light, which creates chemical changes in the brain that can lift mood and ease other symptoms of Seasonal Affective Disorder (SAD) and depression. It can also help with sleep disorders and jet lag.

To reserve a lamp, visit our catalog at http://catalog. ualibrary.org and search for "light therapy lamp." Lamps circulate for 28 days and are not eligible for automatic renewals. They can be picked up at any of our three locations, and must be returned in person, not in our bookdrops.

Light therapy lamps are most effective when used:

- Within the first hour of waking up in the morning.
- For about 20-30 minutes per day.
- At a distance of 16-24 inches from the face.
- With eyes open, sitting or working nearby, but not looking directly at the light.

These Circadian Optics Light Therapy Lamps are UV-free and simple to use: just plug in, press the button and relax. The lamps are safe for most adults, teens and children to use. However, if you have any of the following medical conditions, it is best to be under the care of a health professional while using light therapy:

- You have a condition that makes your skin especially sensitive to light, such as systemic lupus erythematosus,
- You take medications that increase your sensitivity to sunlight, such as certain antibiotics, anti-inflammatories or the herbal supplement St. John's Wort,
- You have an eye condition that makes your eyes vulnerable to light damage,
- You have bipolar disorder.




