Beth Hatch is New Library Director

After conducting a nationwide search, the Upper Arlington Public Library's Board of Trustees is pleased to announce that Beth Hatch was selected to be the Library's fifth director in its 52 year history. Beth, formerly director of the Perry Public Library in Perry, Ohio, started her position on October 15.

She has over 16 years of experience in a variety of roles in Ohio public libraries. In addition to serving as Director, she has served as a Special Projects Manager, Virtual Services Manager, PR and Marketing Librarian, and Reference Librarian

Beth holds a Bachelor of Arts in English and Master of Library and Information Science from Kent State University.

"I am honored to serve as director of Upper Arlington Public Library, and will continue the stellar work that Chris Taylor accomplished during her tenure," she said. "I am looking forward to working with such an enthusiastic and dedicated staff, which I had the pleasure of meeting during the time I spent learning about the library. I am also excited to become an involved and active member of this wonderful community."

Exhibit Highlights African- American Picture Book Creators

In January and February, the Main Library will host a traveling exhibit of 12 panels devoted to the art of African-American children's picture books.

The exhibit, titled Telling a People's Story, emphasizes the strength of illustrations as a visual narrative of the African-American experience.

Organized by Miami University Art Museum through a grant from the Martha Holden Jennings Foundation, the exhibit is a view into the cultural, historical and social makeup of the African-American cultural identity, and brings African-American picture book authors and illustrators into the spotlight.

The themes and time periods referenced in the exhibit include African origins, middle passage, slavery, emancipation, reconstruction, Harlem Renaissance, segregation and the civil rights movement. Additionally, it highlights historical figures in politics, music, sports, art and entertainment.

As a complement to the exhibit, the library will welcome children's author and illustrator, Oge Mora, on February 15. For more information, see page 8.
